Preface

The network video encoder WJ-GXE500 or WJ-GXE500E (hereinafter, the unit) is designed to operate using a PC on a network (10BASE-T/100BASE-TX).

The unit can also capture images from up to 4 analog cameras and compress the images in JPEG, MPEG-4 or H.264 files.

By connecting to a network (LAN) or the Internet, images and audio from the unit can be monitored on a PC via a network. (Audio function is available only for images from Ch1.)

Note:

 It is necessary to configure the network settings of the PC and its network environment to monitor images and audio from the unit on the PC. It is also necessary to install a web browser on the PC.

Main functions

Motion adaptive interlace/progressive conversion function

It is possible to generate digital images with smooth movements by detecting moving areas to process analog images.

Coaxial communication with cameras

This unit can control the pan/tilt heads and lenses of optional combination cameras with the coaxial communication.

Cable compensation

This unit compensates the deterioration of analog images caused by long-distance transmission to maintain the image clearness.

Power over Ethernet function

When connecting with a PoE (Power over Ethernet) device, power will be supplied by simply connecting a LAN cable. (IEEE802.3afcompliant)

Interactive communication with audio is available (Only for images from Ch1)

By using the audio output connector and the microphone input connector, receiving audio from the unit on a PC and transmitting audio from the PC to the unit is available.

SDHC/SD memory card slot equipped

The images at alarm occurrence or network failure can be saved on an SDHC/SD memory card (option). Images can be directly saved on an SDHC/SD memory card. The images on an SDHC/SD memory card can be reproduced on a web browser or downloaded via a web browser. (Recommended SDHC/SD memory card 🖙 page 30)

RS-485 command table

This unit can support RS-485 commands in various formats by uploading a command table to the unit.


About the [INITIAL SET] button

After turning off the power of the unit, turn on the power of the unit while holding down this button, and wait for around 5 seconds or more without releasing this button. Wait around 2 minutes after releasing the button. The unit will start up and the settings including the network settings will be initialized. Before initializing the settings, it is recommended to copy down the settings in advance.





Rack mounting

1 Remove the rubber feet (4 pcs.) from the bottom of the unit.




- 2 Install the rack mount brackets (Option: Refer to the following.) on both sides of the unit. Using the bracket mounting screws (6 pcs.) for the rack mount brackets, fix them firmly. When installing three units: Model No. WV-Q204/2S
 - Rack mount bracket x 2 pcs.
 - Joint bracket x 4 pcs.
 - Bracket mounting screws (M3 x 8: 6 pcs.)
 - Bracket mounting screws (Flat-head M3 x 6: 16 pcs.) Rack mounting screws (locally procured, diameter 5 tapping: 4 pcs.)



3 Install the unit in the rack.

• Using the rack mounting screws, fix them firmly.



 Be sure to keep the temperature inside the rack below 30 °C {86 °F} when operating the units. Installing ventilation fan(s) in the rack is recommended especially when the rack is covered with front lids.


- When operating the units, keep the temperature inside the rack surely below 45 °C {113 °F}.
- To prevent the unit from overheating, do not block the ventilation openings or slots in the cover.

Important:

- Before inserting the SDHC/SD memory card, turn off the power of the unit first.
- Insert an SDHC/SD memory card frontside up.
- Before removing the SDHC/SD memory card, select "Not use" for "SD memory card" on the [SD memory card] tab of "Basic" on the setup menu first. Turn off the power after "Not use" selection, and then unload the SDHC/SD memory card. (re Operating Instructions)

How to insert an SDHC/SD memory card

1 Open the SDHC/SD memory card slot cover by loosening a screw.





3 Close the SDHC/SD memory card slot cover and tighten the screw.

How to remove the SDHC/SD memory card


- 1 Open the SDHC/SD memory card slot cover by following steps 1 of the "How to insert an SDHC/SD memory card" section.
- **2** Release the locked SDHC/SD memory card by pushing the card and then pull the SDHC/SD memory card from the slot.
- 3 Close the SDHC/SD memory card slot cover and tighten the screw.

Before starting the connection, turn off the power of this unit and connected devices. Before start the connection, prepare the required devices and cables.

1 Connect the coaxial cables to the video input connectors on the rear of the unit. Set the termination (75 Ω) on or off with the set switches as necessary. Video input connectors 1 to 4 are associated with Ch 1 to 4.



2 Connect the microphone to the microphone/line input connector (for use of the audio reception function).



3 Connect an external speaker with the amplifier to the audio output connector (for use of the audio transmission function).

Connect a stereo mini plug (ø3.5 mm) (monaural output).

• Recommended cable length: Less than 10 m {32.81'}






When using 12 V DC power supply




When using PoE (IEEE802.3af compliant)


